The novel also packs a complex love story between Ifemelu and Obinze, who moves to London and has to live there as an undocumented immigrant. They both need to teach the other everything they need to know to be able to produce something in a genre they're not used to working in. We are adhering to "beach reads" rules though; most of the titles here are either total page-turners or grant some instant gratification — or both. And while Joan Lindsay's writing style and the setting for this novel may have you drawing some parallels with other classic coming-of-age novels written by and starring women, the ending Picnic at Hanging Rock could only have been written in the 1960s.
